<p>2. Why do computer games have age limits?</p>	<p>a. They have age limits as they can contain violence and bad language.</p>	<p>b. They have age limits so that older brothers and sisters can stop you from playing them.</p>	<p>c. It is an excuse for adults to not have to buy them for there children.</p>
<p>3. How do you think Archie's friend Jack feels when he starts to 'play fight' with him?</p>	<p>a. Jack thinks it's funny and it's just a game.</p>	<p>b. He knows Archie is only 'play fighting' so there is no need to get scared.</p>	<p>c. Jack is scared and frightened that Archie might go too far.</p>
<p>4. Should Alex tell his Uncle Kev that he saw Archie play fighting with his friend Jack?</p>	<p>a. No, because it's not fair to tell on his younger brother and he was only playing.</p>	<p>b.
